BOROUGH ADMINISTRATOR DOLLINGER:

1. A recommendation was made to increase the escrow levels for the Planning and Zoning Boards from \$350 to \$850 to bring them more in line with surrounding municipalities.

BOROUGH CLERK COLE:

1. The Borough Clerk was in receipt of the following letter, dated March 5th:

Dear Ms. Cole:

Enclosed please find a map of our proposed paving and drainage program for the Paddock Plaza Shopping Center this year. The area in front of Shop-Rite needs to be reconstructed due to drainage issues. Shop-Rite is open from 6am to midnight every day. To lessen the impact on Shop-Rite, our paving contractor will start around 11pm the first evening to remove the asphalt area shown in purple. They will construct a stone subbase and asphalt base course and finish around 8am. The second evening they will mill the area shown in green and overlay the green and purple areas with asphalt surface course. For the second evening, they will start and finish the same times as the first evening.

The storm drainage improvements will take two days and be done during the day time before the paving work. All of our tenants will be

sent notices at least two days prior to the work proceeding. Shop-Rite has indicated that a middle of the week schedule will have the least impact. Thank you for your consideration.
