Mayor Tucci reported that in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 adequate notice of this meeting of the Mayor and Council has been provided.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Mayor Tucci reported that the Emergency Management Coordinator met with representatives of the Fire Department, First Aid Squad, Police Department, and Public Works Department on Monday night in preparation for the expected storm on Tuesday. Based on the information on hand at that meeting, which was projecting twelve to eighteen inches of snow, it was determined to cancel garbage collection on Tuesday and recycling collection on Wednesday. Further, the Planning Board meeting scheduled for Tuesday was canceled, and Court was canceled for Wednesday. The public schools were also closed. She thanked the Emergency Management Coordinator for keeping the public informed via CodeRED and Nixle messages and Facebook and the various department heads for taking

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action to prepare for the storm. Finally, she noted that the projected snow came as rain which flooded the Borough Clerk's office. The Mayor encouraged the public to sign up for CodeRED and Nixle to ensure that they receive important information from the town.

Councilman Bray reported that the Finance Committee met with the C.F.O. and Acting Administrator/Borough Clerk on March 9th to discuss the budget, which is scheduled to be introduced on April 5th. It is expected that the Committee will meet once more before the budget introduction.

Councilman Bray stated that it is anticipated that a resolution will be prepared for action at the April 5th meeting to approve a contract for the Borough's new website.

Councilwoman Juliano reported that she attended a brunch last Sunday sponsored by the First Aid Squad honoring Jeff Newenhouse for his service as Captain for the past four years. Michael Rescinio has taken over as First Aid Captain in 2017.

Councilwoman Juliano read the following report from the Captain of the First Aid Squad for the month of February 2017.

Councilwoman Juliano pointed out that there have been a lot of problems with the vehicles, which has required large expenditures for repairs. Mayor Tucci added that it was noted during Monday's storm preparation meeting that one of the ambulances was out of service. Also, radio communications was brought up at that meeting as another issue. Councilwoman Juliano responded that a technician from A.R. Communications was called out to work on the radios. Councilman Migliaccio commented that there will be a problem with interdepartmental communications because they are on the trunk system, which is beyond our control.

Councilwoman Mango reported that she attended the March meeting of the Recreation Commission, which was held at the Chair's house due to the fact that he is presently unable to leave the house. She noted that the Borough Clerk informed them that these are public meetings that must be held in a public location. Therefore, alternate arrangements will be made for next month's meeting. She reported that the Recreation Commission is working on the following projects:

- The Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for Saturday, April 15th, at 10:30 AM.
- The Summer Recreation program will be held at Shore Regional High School again this year.
- This year's concerts will be held on July 4th, July 14th, July 28th, August 11th, and August 25th.
- Flags will be placed on the light poles around Franklin Lake. If the Commission decides to install them on the telephone poles along Locust Avenue, they will have to coordinate with the Borough Clerk for JCP&L approval.
- Plans are being developed for a bocce court.
- The Recreation Commission is seeking a new secretary.

Councilwoman Mango reported that she attended the March meeting of the Environmental and Shade Tree Commissions. The Shade Tree Commission

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discussed the ongoing problem with the Emerald Ash Borer feeding on ash trees. In the meantime, they are discouraging the planting of any more ash trees. Also, the Commissions are tying Arbor Day in with the semi-annual recycling event. The Arbor Day ceremony will take place at Frank Antonides School tentatively on April 28th. The spring semi-annual recycling event, which includes personal document shredding, an electronics dropoff, and a dropoff for Soles4Souls, is scheduled for April 29th.

Councilman Migliaccio had nothing to report this evening.

Councilman Neyhart had nothing to report this evening.

Councilman Penta commented that he has been working with representatives of T&M Associates and received a new infrastructure road map today.

The Borough Clerk reported that the Borough auctioned off the 2003 Peterbilt garbage truck on GovDeals.com. The Borough will receive \$18,518.50 after all fees are paid.

The Borough Clerk commented that the Public Works Department is down to one garbage truck because the other two need repairs.

WHEREAS, an unfunded mandate upon boards of education(,) municipalities, and counties is a law, rule, or regulation that does not authorize resources, other than property tax, to offset additional direct expenditures required to implement said law, rule or regulation; and

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WHEREAS, other than the collection of local property taxes, the Criminal Justice Reform Act did not allocate monies to county or municipal governing bodies to offset the costs associated with implementing and administering the Criminal Justice Reform Act in violation of New Jersey's constitution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Keyport, County of Monmouth, does in fact hereby support the filing of a complaint by New Jersey Association of Counties with the New Jersey Council on Local Mandates that the Criminal Justice Reform Act (N.J.S.A. 2A:162-15 eq. Seq.) constitutes an unfunded State mandate in violation of Article VIII, Section II, Paragraph 5 of the New Jersey Constitution.
