### PUBLIC HEARING:

- 1. Honora Ornstein, 11 Maryland Ave, West Long Branch stated that she attends the senior stretching class at the community center and asked if an exterminator can be called for service at the center. Councilman Sniffen stated that it is an ongoing issue and an exterminator services the community center often. Mrs. Ornstein asked what the status was on the traffic light at the intersection of Palmer Ave and Monmouth Road. Mayor Tucci replied that the timeline is no longer in our control as the matter is under the County's authority now.
- 2. David Ornstein, 11 Maryland Ave, West Long Branch expressed concern with the Borough's Website and stated that he had difficulty locating information that he needed. The Borough Clerk stated that she would reach out to and assist Mr. Ornstein with his questions about the website during Borough Hall business hours. Mr. Ornstein asked if anyone had come up with any ideas related to the traffic build-up at the intersection of Monmouth Road and Parker. Councilman Cioffi replied that the only feasible option at this time would be to adjust the timing on the left-turn signal at the stop-light, which should alleviate the issue.
