A regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of West Long Branch was held on the above date and time in the Council Chambers, Borough Hall, 965 Broadway, West Long Branch, N.J.

Mayor Janet W. Tucci presided.

Mayor Tucci reported that in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 adequate notice of this meeting of the Mayor and Council has been provided.

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APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The Borough Clerk noted that the minutes of the November 1<sup>st</sup> meeting were not ready for approval this evening.

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REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Councilman Bray reported that the Finance Committee met with the Borough Administrator, C.F.O., and Purchasing Agent on November 29<sup>th</sup> to discuss the 2018 budget requests, the RFQ's for the 2018 professional services, and the termination of the contract with the current IT vendor and a new shared services agreement with the City of Long Branch for the provision of IT services.

Councilwoman Juliano read the following report from the Captain of the First Aid Squad for the month of November 2017.

Councilwoman Juliano noted that a meeting has been requested regarding dual dispatch for West Long Branch and Elberon First Aid Squads.

Councilwoman Mango had nothing to report on behalf of the Environmental Commission or the Shade Tree Commission.

Councilwoman Mango announced that this year's Christmas Sing is scheduled for December 17<sup>th</sup>, from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM, at Franklin Lake. She expressed concern that there could be a problem with the lights for the tree. Councilman Migliaccio assured her that the lights should be put on the tree within the next couple of days. Further, he thanked Tom Juliano for engineering the electrical system so that a temporary line could be run to the tree for the lights.

Councilman Migliaccio stated that he will be making a motion tonight to accept a proposal from T&M Associates for the pre-design phase of the renovations to the Public Works building.

Councilman Neyhart encouraged drivers to slow down because there have been some motor vehicle accidents caused by deer.

Councilman Neyhart confirmed his attendance at the 2017/2018 Elected/Appointed Officials Liability Seminar, which was sponsored by the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund, so that the Borough will receive a \$250.00 credit on its insurance premium.

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Councilman Neyhart reported that he met with different vendors at the League Conference. He indicated that he obtained information from an asphalt patch vendor and gave that information to the Public Works Director.

Councilman Neyhart mentioned that the Borough Administrator will be taking a picture of the Mayor and Council at the end of the meeting to be used in the 2018 Calendar. The Borough Clerk stated that the calendar is done, but has not been printed yet. Councilman Neyhart asked the Borough Clerk to ensure that the fireworks donation letter is included in the calendar and to arrange for the Public Works Department to hand deliver them again this year.

Councilman Neyhart recommended that the Mayor and Council go back into executive session following tonight's regular meeting to discuss the Council committees for 2018.

Councilwoman Juliano reported that she received an e-mail advising that the Fire Department's subscription to IamResponding is set to expire on December 27<sup>th</sup>. Councilman Migliaccio instructed her to forward it to Ron Guidetti.

Councilman Penta stated that an investigation needs to be done to determine why the lights around Franklin Lake keep going out.

Councilman Penta requested that Julie Nastasi, of T&M Associates, who was in the audience, give an update on the 2016 capital improvement program. Ms. Nastasi reported that the only remaining item is various pavement repairs and that the project is under budget. Further, she advised that the sidewalk improvement program, which is being funded through a New Jersey Department of Transportation grant, is complete and is also under budget. Councilman Penta extended his appreciation to Fran Mullan, the Borough Engineer, and Julie Nastasi, of his office, for their efforts in overseeing these projects and moving them along.

Mayor Tucci acknowledged Stephanie Murray for being honored at the League of Municipalities Conference by the Women in Municipal Government Committee for dedicating her time and energy toward the advancement of women in municipal government in her role as Middletown's Deputy Mayor.

The Borough Administrator had nothing to report.

The Borough Clerk reported that there is information posted in Dropbox regarding a seminar sponsored by the New Jersey State League of Municipalities entitled "Budgeting for the Elected Official" to be held on Saturday, February 24, 2018, at The Conference Center at Mercer.

The Borough Clerk reported that there is information posted in Dropbox regarding a seminar sponsored by the New Jersey State League of Municipalities entitled "An Orientation for Municipal Officials that are Newly Elected, Re-Elected, or Experienced" to be held on Saturday, January 6, 2018, at the Hilton Meadowlands Hotel, and on Saturday, January 20, 2018, at the Hotel ML.

The Borough Attorney had nothing to report.

The Borough Engineer stated that he submitted his status report outlining work in progress. Further, he thanked Councilman Penta for his acknowledgement of T&M Associates' work and recognized Julie Nastasi who does a great job and is dedicated to work for the Borough's best interest.

ORDINANCE NO. O-17-8

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE DISTANCE REQUIREMENTS IN  
ORDINANCE 6-6.3  
IN THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH

Ordinance No. O-17-8 is read on its second reading by title only.

Councilman Neyhart moved the ordinance be passed on its second reading, seconded by Councilman Bray, and carried upon the following roll call vote:

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ORDINANCE NO. O-17-8

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE DISTANCE REQUIREMENTS IN  
ORDINANCE 6-6.3  
IN THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH

Councilman Neyhart moved the ordinance be passed on its third and final reading, seconded by Councilman Bray, and carried upon the following roll call vote:

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It was determined to re-introduce Ordinance No. O-17-9, which was previously introduced at the November 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, as follows with changes to the fee schedule contained in Section 9.

ORDINANCE NO. O-17-9

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PERSONS FROM APPROACHING  
CERTAIN RESIDENCES THAT HAVE REGISTERED WITH  
THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH AND AMENDING  
ORDINANCE 4-3.1 AND 4-3.10

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have received, both at the regular council meetings and by phone and in person, several complaints by residents about people coming to their homes unsolicited, when the property owners do not want such visitors; and

WHEREAS, the governing body has discussed this issue and reviewed the “No Knock” ordinance in Ocean Township, the borough’s neighbor, and finds that such an ordinance would address many of the stated concerns of the borough’s residents;



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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of West Long Branch as follows:

SECTION 1. TITLE

This ordinance shall be known as the borough's NO KNOCK ORDINANCE.

SECTION 2. NO KNOCK REGISTRY

A registry shall be established in the Borough Clerk's office which contains a list of addresses of those premises where the owner or occupant has notified the Borough Clerk that he/she wishes to prohibit persons and entities from canvassing, soliciting, peddling, itinerant vending or attempting door-to-door sales on his/her premises.

SECTION 3. DISPLAY STICKER

A. Any owner or occupant who requests his/her property be listed on the No Knock Registry shall be able to procure at no charge from the Borough Clerk's office a sticker for display at his/her premises which shall serve as notice that this property is on the No Knock Registry. There shall be no charge for registering.

B. If any premises is on the No Knock Registry, the owner or occupant shall be obligated to post the sticker for display in a readily observable location near the front door.

SECTION 4. AVAILABILITY OF LIST

A. The list of addresses referred to in section 1 shall be available at the Borough Clerk's office during normal business hours, and shall be updated monthly.

B. Any person seeking to undertake any action referred to in section 2 above shall be obligated to obtain a current up-to-date copy of the registry. It is, therefore, the obligation of the canvasser, solicitor, peddler itinerant vendor or door-to-door salesperson to have the most up to date list from the registry.

C. The Borough Clerk shall provide any person seeking to canvass, solicit, peddle, act as an itinerant vendor or undertake any door-to-door sale with a copy of the current registry.

SECTION 5. DEFINITION

For purposes of this Ordinance, the definition of "soliciting" in Ordinance 4-3 shall be expanded to include attempts to purchase, directly or by third party, as well as to sell. Ordinance 4-3.1 is hereby amended to include this definition under "canvassers and solicitors".

SECTION 6. VIOLATIONS

Any person who appears at a property on the No Knock Registry, where the property has been so posted in accordance with Section 3 of this Ordinance, shall be considered to be in violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. EXCEPTIONS

The following persons are exempt from compliance with this Ordinance:

A. Members of religious groups who appear at the premises for those purposes.

B. Political or political action group persons who appear at the premises for those purposes.

C. Halloween trick or treaters.

SECTION 8. PENALTY

Any person violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be subject to the following penalties:

- A. First offense—a fine of \$300.00.
- B. Second offense—a fine of \$1,000.00
- C. Third or subsequent offense—a fine of not less than \$1,000.00, nor more than \$2,000.00 and, in the discretion of the court, jail of not more than ninety (90) days.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT TO FEE SCHEDULE IN ORDINANCE 4-3.10

The following amendments to Ordinance 4-3.10 are made:

4-3.10a. *Peddlers.* For each peddler, regardless of the method used for transporting his wares and merchandise, ~~fifty (\$50.00)~~ two hundred (\$200.00) dollars per calendar month; ~~fifteen (\$15.00)~~ fifty (\$50.00) dollars for one (1) week, which is defined as running from Sunday to the following Saturday.

4-3.10b. *Transient Merchants.* The sum of ~~three hundred (\$300.00)~~ five hundred (\$500.00) dollars per calendar year ..... [balance of 4-3.10b remains unchanged]

4-3.10e. *For All Other Licenses:* The fee shall be ~~fifty (\$50.00)~~ five hundred (\$500.00) dollars per calendar year. The fee for borough-run functions shall be twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per day. [balance of 4-3.10e remains unchanged]

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect January 1, 2018 or upon passage and publication according to law, whichever is later.

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ORDINANCE NO. O-17-10

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS AND AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT (“ADA”) SIDEWALK RAMP CONSTRUCTION AND/OR IMPROVEMENTS WITH, BY AND IN THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$883,043 THEREFOR (INCLUDING A GRANT EXPECTED TO BE RECEIVED FROM THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$112,243) AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$840,993 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement or purpose to be undertaken by the Borough of West Long Branch, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$883,043, which sum includes a grant (said grant allocable to the Americans With Disabilities Act ("ADA") Sidewalk Ramp Construction and/or Improvements) expected be received from the County of Monmouth Community Development Block Grant Program in the amount of \$112,243 (the "Grant") and \$42,050 as the amount of down payment for said improvement or purpose required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. Said down payment is now available therefore by virtue of a provision or provisions in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes or from moneys actually held by the Borough.

**SECTION 2.** For the financing of said improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the \$883,043 appropriation not provided for by application of said down payment, and until said Grant is received, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$840,993 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$883,043 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Upon the Borough's receipt of the Grant, the bonds and notes authorized by this Section 2 hereof shall be reduced by the Grant in accordance with Section 4 hereof.

**SECTION 3.** (a) The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said bonds or notes are to be issued include, but are not limited to, various roadway improvements to Lakeview Avenue (from Locust Avenue to Franklin Lake); Monroe Street (from Wall Street to Cedar Avenue); Orchard Road (from Oakwood Avenue to Judith Place); and a portion of Muncy Drive, which improvements shall include, but are not limited to, as applicable, excavation, milling, paving, reconstruction and boxing out and resurfacing or full depth pavement replacement, drainage improvements and isolated curb, sidewalk and/or driveway improvements; drainage improvements at various locations throughout the Borough; and ADA Sidewalk Ramp Construction and/or Improvements at various locations throughout the Borough (collectively, the "Project"). The Project shall include, but not be limited to, as applicable, roadway painting and striping, traffic control, landscaping and aesthetic improvements, seeding and installing top soil, and shall also include all engineering and design work, surveying, construction planning, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, construction inspection and contract administration, and all work, materials, equipment, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all in accordance with the plans therefor on file in the office of the Borough Clerk and available for public inspection and hereby approved.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvement or purpose is \$840,993. Upon the Borough's receipt of the Grant, the maximum amount of bonds or notes issued for said improvement or purpose shall be reduced by such amounts in accordance with Section 4 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of said improvement or purpose is \$883,043, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, and until the Grant has been received, being the amount of \$42,050, is comprised of the down payment for said improvement or purpose.

**SECTION 4.** In the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, and/or the County of Monmouth make a contribution or grant in aid to the Borough, including the Grant, for the improvement and purpose authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Borough prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Monmouth. In the event, however, that any amount so contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey and/or the County of Monmouth, including the Grant, shall be received by the Borough after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so

issued and shall be used for no other purpose.

**SECTION 5.** All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date or otherwise authorized by the Local Bond Law. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

**SECTION 6.** The Capital Budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency, a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs will be on file in the office of the Clerk and will be available for public inspection.

**SECTION 7.** The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is an improvement which the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of said improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 15 years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$883,043 and the said bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$176,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement hereinbefore described.

**SECTION 8.** The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance. The bonds or notes shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the bonds or notes and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

**SECTION 9.** The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue the bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of

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the purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 9 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

**SECTION 10.** The Borough Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the “Rule”) for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

**SECTION 11.** The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under section 103(a) of the Code of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this ordinance.

**SECTION 12.** This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

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ORDINANCE NO. O-17-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING FEES FOR VARIOUS BUILDING  
AND OCCUPANCY PERMITS IN THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH

WHEREAS, the governing body has been studying the fee structure of its Ordinances for Certificates of Occupancy and other related permit fees; and

WHEREAS, the governing body has looked into the fees being charged by other Municipalities in this area of Monmouth County, and finds that West Long Branch’s fees are lower than most, if not all; and

WHEREAS, the cost of doing business, with manpower and office expenses having increased over the years, dictates that the Borough increase its fees accordingly;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of West Long Branch that following Ordinances shall be amended as follows:

SECTION 1. COST OF INSPECTION. Ordinance 9-2.10a and 9-2.10c regarding the cost of Certificate of Occupancy inspections shall be amended to read as follows:

a. Single-family dwellings---~~forty five (\$45.00)~~ one hundred (\$100.00) dollars per unit, which fees shall also include rentals of single family homes. [Balance of this Ordinance sections remains unchanged].

WHEREAS, the Borough of West Long Branch (the "Borough"), in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need to permanently finance the refunding of various emergency appropriations to provide funds to pay Borough obligations associated with (i) a post-verdict settlement (\$610,000) and the Ciaglia Judgment (\$245,000) (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has duly adopted various refunding bond ordinances (the "Ordinances") to appropriate moneys and authorize the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes to effect the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined to finance the Project with the proceeds of a loan (the "Loan") to be made to the Borough by The Monmouth County Improvement Authority (the "MCIA"); and

WHEREAS, in order for the Borough to receive the Loan from the MCIA, it is necessary to combine the Refunding Bonds authorized under said Ordinances into one consolidated issue of general obligation refunding bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$855,000 (to be issued in one or more separate series aggregating said amount and each series having a separate name or designation), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq., as amended and supplemented (the "Local Bond Law"); and

WHEREAS, to evidence the Loan, the MCIA also requires the Borough to authorize, execute, attest and deliver the Borough's not to exceed \$855,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds (to be issued in one or more separate series aggregating said amount and each series having a separate name or designation) (the "Refunding Bonds") in accordance with the provisions hereof and pursuant to the terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law; and

WHEREAS, section 27(a)(2) and Section 59 of the Local Bond Law allows for the sale of the Refunding Bonds to the MCIA without any public offering, all under the terms and conditions set forth herein and in a Bond Purchase Agreement by and between the Borough and the MCIA to be dated as of the date of the sale of such Refunding Bonds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-26(f), the refunding bonds of the Borough, authorized pursuant to the Ordinances of the Borough heretofore adopted and described in Section 2 hereof, shall be combined into a single issue of General Obligation Refunding Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$855,000 to be issued in one or more separate series aggregating said amount and each series having a separate name or designation.

Section 2. The principal amount of bonds authorized by each ordinance to be combined into a single issue as above provided, the Ordinances authorizing the Refunding Bonds described by reference to the ordinance number, description and date of final adoption, amount of issue and average period of usefulness determined in each of the Ordinances are respectively as follows:

Section 3. The following matters are hereby determined with respect to the combined issue of Bonds:

(a) The Refunding Bonds of the combined issue shall be designated “General Obligation Refunding Bonds” (or such other designation if such Refunding Bonds are issued in one or more separate series and each series having a separate name or designation).

(b) The applicable Bonds of the combined issue shall be sold and issued in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law that are applicable to the sale and issuance of bonds authorized by a single bond ordinance and accordingly may be sold with other issues of bonds.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) None of the Refunding Bonds described in Section 2 hereof have been sold or issued heretofore, and the various Ordinances described in Section 2 have not been rescinded heretofore and now remain in full force and effect as authorizations for the respective amounts of bonds set opposite the descriptions of the Ordinances set forth in Section 2 hereof.

(b) The several purposes or improvements authorized by the respective Ordinances described in Section 2 hereof are purposes for which bonds may be issued lawfully pursuant to the Local Bond Law and some of such improvements or purposes, if applicable and permitted by law, a deduction may be taken in any annual or supplemental debt statement.

Section 5. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-27(a)(2) and N.J.S.A. 40A:2-59, the Borough hereby sells and awards the Borough’s not to exceed \$855,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds (the “Bonds”) to the MCIA in accordance with the provisions hereof and in accordance with the terms of a Bond Purchase Agreement by and between the Borough and the MCIA (the “Bond Purchase Agreement”). The Mayor of the Borough (the “Mayor”) or the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough (the “Chief Financial Officer”) are each hereby authorized and directed on behalf of the Borough, in consultation with Bond Counsel (as hereinafter defined), to negotiate the terms of such Bond Purchase Agreement, to be dated the date of sale of the Refunding Bonds, to approve the terms of aforesaid Bond Purchase Agreement and to execute and deliver said Bond Purchase Agreement to the MCIA. The Refunding Bonds have been referred to and described in the Ordinances being finally adopted at duly called and held meetings of the Borough Council and published as required by law and which Ordinances where combined for purposes of sale pursuant to this resolution, all pursuant to terms of the Local Bond Law and other applicable law.

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Section 6. The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough is hereby authorized and directed to determine, in accordance with the Local Bond Law and pursuant to the terms and conditions established by the MCIA and the terms and conditions hereof and set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement, the following items with respect to the Refunding Bonds, except those terms and conditions which are set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement:

- (a) The aggregate principal amount of the Refunding Bonds to be issued, provided that the total amount of Bonds issued shall not exceed the aggregate principal amount of \$855,000 (which may be issued in one or more separate series aggregating said amount);
- (b) The maturity and principal installments of the Refunding Bonds shall be in accordance with the approval of the Local Finance Board;
- (c) The date of the Refunding Bonds;
- (d) The interest rates of the Refunding Bonds;
- (e) The purchase price of the Refunding Bonds; and
- (f) The terms and conditions under which the Refunding Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities.

Section 7. Any determination made by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms hereof shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation of the Refunding Bonds by the parties authorized under Section 8(c) hereof.

Section 8. The Borough Council hereby determines that certain terms of the Refunding Bonds shall be as follows:

- (a) The Refunding Bonds shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered GOR-1 (or such other designation if such Refunding Bonds are issued in one or more separate series);
- (b) The Refunding Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owners thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
- (c) The Refunding Bonds shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor of the Borough and the Chief Financial Officer under official seal or facsimile thereof affixed, printed, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Clerk of the Borough (the "Borough Clerk").

Section 9. The Refunding Bonds shall be in the form set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto with such additions, deletions and omissions as may be necessary for the Borough to comply with the requirements of the MCIA, upon the advice of Bond Counsel to the Borough (as defined herein).

Section 10. The law firm of Archer & Greiner P.C., Red Bank, New Jersey, Bond Counsel to the Borough ("Bond Counsel"), the Borough Attorney and the Borough Auditor are each hereby authorized and directed to perform all actions necessary to consummate the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and the Project for which the Refunding Bonds are issued including, but not limited to, drafting and arranging for the printing and execution of the Refunding Bonds and all applicable documentation necessary to memorialize and consummate the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and the undertaking of the Project, preparing all necessary financial information, and conducting all necessary studies and analysis in connection with the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and the undertaking of the Project. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer, the Borough Clerk, the Borough Attorney and any other Borough representative (including Bond Counsel or the Borough Auditor) are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any certificates necessary or desirable in connection with the financial and other information.



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Section 11. The Mayor, the Chief Financial Officer, the Borough Clerk and any other Borough representative, are each hereby authorized and directed to (i) execute any certificates or documents necessary or desirable in connection with the sale of the Refunding Bonds, including the Bond Purchase Agreement, or the undertaking of the Project and each are hereby further authorized and directed to deliver same to the MCIA upon delivery of the Refunding Bonds and the receipt of payment therefor or in accordance with the MCIA, and (ii) perform such other actions as they deem necessary, desirable or convenient, in consultation with Bond Counsel, in relation to the execution and delivery thereof. The Mayor or Chief Financial Officer of the Borough are each hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforesaid Bonds and to determine all matters in connection with the Refunding Bonds (including adjusting the maturity schedule or any other matters set forth in this resolution that are deemed necessary and advisable to change by the Mayor or Chief Financial Officer of the Borough prior to the sale or closing of the Refunding Bonds, all in consultation with Bond Counsel, and the Auditor), and the manual or facsimile signature of the Mayor or Chief Financial Officer of the Borough upon any documents shall be conclusive as to all such determinations. 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PUBLIC HEARING:

Tom DeBruin, 36 DeForrest Place, thanked the Mayor and Council for recognizing his mother, Ruth DeBruin, on her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday. He also thanked them for the time and effort they put into making the Borough a great place to live. Further, he commended Julie Nastasi for giving her report this evening without the need for notes. Finally, he noted that Joan Spiegel, who was a member of the Leisure Club, passed away earlier this month.

Mark Engel, Park Meadow Lane, asked for the status of the request for a traffic light at the intersection of Monmouth Road and Palmer Avenue. The Mayor responded that the request is in the hands of the County Engineer’s office.

Vincent Lepore, 33 Ocean Terrace, Long Branch, commented on the following items:

- He commended the Mayor and Council for entering an agreement with the City of Long Branch for the provision of IT services.
- He questioned the fact that the word “Botti” is not mentioned in Resolution No. R-17-119. The Borough Attorney pointed out that he did not prepare that resolution. Mr. Lepore reiterated his comments from prior meetings about the indemnification granted in the Botti litigation, but stated that he still felt that the employee should be held accountable to pay the settlement since he violated the indemnification agreement.

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- He asked what the source of enforcement will be for the “No Knock” ordinance. The Borough Attorney replied that the ordinance can be enforced by the Police Department or the Code Enforcement Officer.
- He expressed concern with Governor-Elect Murphy’s position relative to the legalization of marijuana because it could impact other people’s quality of life. The Mayor informed him that she attended a League Executive Board meeting today where there was talk that the Governor-Elect’s own people may not support him in this endeavor.
- He stated that he thinks it is important to follow through with the recommendation of a study for the regionalization of pre-K to 12<sup>th</sup> grades in light of the elimination of tax deductions.

There being no one else wishing to speak, on motion made by Councilman Neyhart, seconded by Councilman Bray, and carried unanimously, the regular meeting was adjourned at 9:23 PM, and the Mayor and Council returned to executive session to discuss the 2018 Council committees and adjourn from there.
