Mayor Tucci welcomed Councilman Migliaccio back and noted that Judge Mellaci administered his Oath of Office privately on New Year’s Day.

Councilman Bray stated that the main focus now is on the 2018 municipal budget. He proposed a special meeting to discuss the budget on Wednesday, January 31st, at 6:00 PM. Copies of the budget requests were distributed to the Mayor and Council for their review prior to the meeting with a request that they contact the respective Council liaison with any questions. Councilman Bray offered to coordinate with the Council Liaisons and the Borough Clerk to determine which department heads would be requested to attend the special meeting to review and answer questions concerning their budgets.

Councilman Penta thanked the Public Works Department for the outstanding job they did cleaning up during the recent snowstorm. He noted that the Borough’s fuel supplier ran low during the storm, which caused the Public Works Director to suspend plowing operations overnight. However, they resumed plowing and salting the next day.

The Mayor asked the Police Chief how many tickets were issued for vehicles parked on the street when they were snow covered. According to Chief Habermann, forty-eight summonses were issued.

No one had anything to report on behalf of Councilwoman Mango. Councilman Migliaccio commented that the Recreation Commission canceled their meeting.

Unit 53-56 had to be sent back to PL Custom Body & Equipment for repairs. There were no issues with Unit 53-57. The new Chevrolet Tahoe should be delivered from Elite Equipment within the next few days.

Councilman Migliaccio advised that the demolition of the 95 Poplar building had been held up due to an issue with the sewer line. Presently, the sewer line from the building goes to the center of the lot where the police vehicles were parked. The recommendation was to remove that line in case the Borough ever decided to sell that portion of the property and have the contractor run a new line

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to the street for the Library, which would cost \$6,000. However, after speaking to the Borough's representative to the Two Rivers Water Reclamation Authority, it was discovered that there was a provision for a one-time waiver of the fee.

Councilman Migliaccio reported that his Committee met with an architect to review the conceptual design plan for the renovations to the Public Works Garage. He stated that once the numbers are finalized, a bond ordinance can be prepared for action by the Council.
