REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Councilman Neyhart congratulated Mayor Tucci on her re-election as Mayor, Councilman Penta on his re-election to the Council, and Steve Cioffi on his election to the Council.

Councilman Neyhart reported the following items on behalf of Councilwoman Mango:

- The Recreation Commission has scheduled a tree lighting ceremony on Sunday, December 2nd, from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM, at Franklin Lake.
- The Environmental Commission has scheduled the semi-annual recycling event for Saturday, November 10th, from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM, in the Borough Hall parking lot. This event includes secure document shredding, collection of electronics, and coat donations.

Councilman Bray reported that the C.F.O., Mike Martin, appeared before the Local Finance Board today for approval of participation in the Monmouth County Improvement Authority's pooled financing program. A formal resolution will be placed on the next regular meeting agenda.

Councilman Bray reported that the C.F.O. and Borough Administrator completed the CY2018/SFY2019 Best Practices Inventory, due by Monday, November 12th. There were 38 "Yes" responses, 2 "No" responses, 9 "N/A" responses, and 12 "Prospective" responses. He noted that no aid would be held based on the total score of 59 (97%) and that the items answered "Prospective" would have to be considered by the Borough in the next year.

Councilman Bray announced that the C.F.O. would be distributing the 2019 budget worksheets by Tuesday.

Councilwoman Juliano reported that she will have the Fire Department report at the next meeting since the Fire Chief was out of town.

Councilwoman Juliano clarified the reduction of time included in the amendment to the Fire Department ordinance was moot because of the training standard.

We had 120 EMS calls for October and 1033 year to date (1074 YTD for 2017). We had mutual aid in for 13% of our EMS calls this month which means we covered 87% of our in-town calls.

During October the ambulances had the following issues:

- 53-56 continues to be used only as a second response vehicle. We had no issues with this unit in September.
- 53-57 We had DPW check and replace the inner and outer rear wheel bearings. This had not been done before and was performed because of a member's noticing and informing me that something was not sounding right. I have all the hardware for the tablet installation and am just waiting for Elite to get the new logo back from the printer. Once that happens I will coordinate the graphics install and GETAC install at the same time.
- The Tahoe had no issues in September.

On Thursday, October 25^{th} the four Captain's from Oceanport, Monmouth Beach, Sea Bright and WLB met to begin formal discussions about creating a joint shared service and soft billing agreement.

We had three standbys for October and I want to thank everybody who volunteered. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Elberon for assisting us with the MU homecoming on Saturday, October 20th. A special thanks to Matt who produced the Department's operations plan for both the Homecoming and the Fall Festival.

So far, we have four standbys for November. All of these are at Monmouth University for either football or basketball games.

The Boy Scouts used our bays on October 18^{th} from 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm. for their scouting recruitment and a sailboat race.

The AFG (Assistance to Firefighters Grant) was submitted on Friday October 26th with the help of the grant writers from Fire Grants Help.

I also applied to the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation for a grant to purchase two Zoll Auto Pulse Systems. The total cost of this request is \$28,440.

I believe Matt came up with the idea to put together a membership presentation for the WLB and Shore Regional PTA/PTO.

Dear Mayor/Freeholder Director/County Executive:

On behalf of Governor Murphy, I am pleased to announce that applications will now be accepted for the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) Fiscal Year 2019 Local Freight Impact Fund. We are committed to maintaining and improving New Jersey's local transportation system by providing financial assistance to counties and municipalities throughout the state. NJDOT's Local Freight Impact Fund is a new grant program since Fiscal Year 2018 and is funded through the Transportation Trust Fund. The Local Freight Impact Fund provides aid to counties and municipalities for transportation projects that address the impacts of freight travel in local communities an on local transportation infrastructure. Available funding for the Fiscal Year 2019 program is \$30.1 million.

The Local Freight Impact Fund is a competitive grant program. Projects submitted for consideration must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Projects must be within the jurisdiction of the applicant's municipality and/or county unless filed jointly with an adjacent municipality and/or county.
- Applicants must demonstrate that the project will provide access to a port, warehouse distribution center or any other freight node by providing a narrative and a map supporting their request.
- Projects must have a minimum 10% large truck volume within the project limits. A traffic study must be submitted to support this information.

Applicants of eligible projects can select from four project categories:

- **Pavement Preservation** to improve pavement conditions in support of freight travel on municipal/county transportation infrastructure.
- **Truck Safety and Mobility** to improve large truck access, routing and mobility along the municipal/county roadway system.
- **Bridge Preservation** to improve bridge ratings/conditions in support of freight travel on municipal/county transportation infrastructure.
- **New Construction** to promote new construction in support of freight travel on municipal/county transportation infrastructure.

The enclosed map provides contact information for each Local Aid District Office. I recommend that you consult with your Local Aid District Office to assist in preparing applications for funding. Please keep in mind that a separate application for each project must be completed and submitted on or **before January 11, 2019** on-line through the Department's electronic grants administration system, known by its acronym SAGE, at: https://njsage.intelligrants.com/Login2.aspx?APPTHEME=NJSAGE

ORDINANCE NO. 0-18-12

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, BY AND IN THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY; APPROPRIATING \$315,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$299,999 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF WEST LONG BRANCH, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement or purpose to be undertaken by the Borough of West Long Branch, in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey (the "Borough"). For the said improvement or purpose stated in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$315,000, which is inclusive of \$15,001 as the amount of down payment for said improvement or purpose required by the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq. (the "Local Bond Law"). Said down payment is now available therefor by virtue of a provision or provisions in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof and to meet the part of said \$315,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$299,999 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$299,999 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued include, but are not limited to:

- (b) The above improvements or purposes set forth in Section 3(a) shall also include, as applicable, all engineering and design work, surveying, planning, construction planning, preparation of plans and specifications, permits, bid documents, construction inspection, reporting and contract administration, and all work, materials, equipment, apparatus, labor and appurtenances necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all in accordance with the plans therefor on file in the office of the Borough Clerk and available for public inspection and hereby approved;
- (c) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said improvement or purpose is \$299,999.
- (d) The estimated cost of said improvement or purpose is \$315,000, inclusive of the down payment in the amount of \$15,001 for said improvement or purpose.
- SECTION 4. In the event the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Monmouth, and/or a private entity make a contribution or grant in aid to the Borough, for the improvement and purpose authorized hereby and the same shall be received by the Borough prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then the amount of such bonds or notes to be issued shall be reduced by the amount so received from the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Monmouth, and/or a private entity. In the event, however, that any amount so contributed or granted by the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, the County of Monmouth, and/or a private entity shall be received by the Borough after the issuance of the bonds or notes authorized in Section 2 hereof, then such funds shall be applied to the payment of the bonds or notes so issued and shall be used for no other purpose. This Section 4 shall not apply, however, with respect to any contribution or grant in aid received by the Borough as a result of using funds from this bond ordinance as "matching local funds" to receive such contribution or grant in aid.
- SECTION 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date or otherwise authorized by the Local Bond Law. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the signature of the Chief Financial Officer upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time in accordance with the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price and accrued interest thereon from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, the description, the interest rate, and the maturity schedule of the notes so sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.
- SECTION 6. The Capital Budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. In the event of any such inconsistency, a resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and capital programs as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs will be on file in the office of the Clerk and will be available for public inspection.
- SECTION 7. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is an improvement which the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

- (b) The average period of usefulness of said improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 6.91 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of the Borough and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds or notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$299,999 and the said bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$100,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under section 20 of the Local Bond Law is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement hereinbefore described.

SECTION 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance. The bonds or notes shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the bonds or notes and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

SECTION 9. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue the bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 9 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

SECTION 10. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The Borough Chief Financial Officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

SECTION 11. The Borough covenants to maintain the exclusion from gross income under Section 103(a) of the Code of the interest on all bonds and notes issued under this bond ordinance.

SECTION 12. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption and approval, as provided by the Local Bond Law.
