REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Mayor Tucci reported that there were 27 new positive cases of COVID-19 in Monmouth County as of today for a total of 9,305 and 1 new death for a total of 715 total deaths. She added that there were 76 cases in West Long Branch.

Mayor Tucci advised that she participated in a Zoom meeting on June 25<sup>th</sup> between representatives of Monmouth Medical Center and the local Mayors. The purpose of the meeting was to assure everyone that the hospital was safe and the staff was being screened so that people would be comfortable to go to the hospital if necessary. People should be encouraged to be vigilant and take care of themselves.

Mayor Tucci noted that it has been determined that schools would be open in September and that it would be up to the local school districts how to comply with the necessary COVID-19 restrictions.

Councilman Neyhart asked about the status of raising the flags. As promised, the Mayor indicated that she brought the subject up during the most recent Zoom call with the Governor and the response was that it would be done by a major holiday, but there was nothing definitive. Councilman Neyhart felt that the Borough should raise the flags despite the Executive Order even if it was just for July 4<sup>th</sup>. Councilman Cioffi expressed concern with violating an Executive Order as a governmental agency. Councilman Neyhart pointed out that this action would not be jeopardizing anyone's health or safety.

Councilman Bray reported that the Notice to Bidders for the West Long Branch Community Center was issued on June  $26^{th}$  and fourteen bid requests were received within the first forty-eight hours. He noted that the initial site inspection was scheduled for Tuesday, July  $7^{th}$ .

Councilman Cioffi had nothing to report this evening.

On behalf of Councilwoman Mango, the Mayor complimented the Recreation Commission on the installation of the flags along Locust Avenue. She thanked Councilmen Cioffi and Sniffen, former Councilman Migliaccio, and the Recreation Commission Chair, Debbie Ronan, for putting them up.

Mayor Tucci also reported that the Environmental Commission hosted the semi-annual recycling event on Saturday, June 27th.

Councilman Neyhart urged residents to lock their doors.

Councilman Neyhart asked Lieutenant Gomez, who was in the audience, to provide an update on the bulletproof vest program. Lieutenant Gomez deferred to Chief Habermann, who was also in the audience. Chief Habermann announced that the West Long Branch Police Department received a \$10,000 donation from the Michael Fux Foundation for the purchase of body armor. Lieutenant Gomez also confirmed that, with the assistance of the Borough Clerk, the Police Department was able to submit an application for funding for a grant for body armor in the amount of approximately \$4,000.

Chief Habermann reminded residents not to leave anything of value in their cars and to lock their cars and not leave the keys/fob inside the car.

Councilman Penta reported that, with the assistance of T&M Associates, he planned to apply for funding up to \$200,000 through the Community Development Block Grant Program for ADA ramps and some sidewalks on Wall Street from Monmouth Road to Whalepond Road.

Mayor Tucci requested that Councilman Penta have something posted on the Borough's website asking residents to break down their boxes and reminding them about the maximum size of garbage cans allowed under the ordinance.

Councilman Sniffen reported that he was working with Chambers Electric on lighting at the West Long Branch Community Center, the Borough Hall parking lot, and two lights for the Police building to shine into the parking lot and on the call box.

The Borough Administrator confirmed that the estimated tax bills were mailed out.

The Borough Administrator advised that the West Long Branch Library was set to reopen next week on a shortened schedule of three days per week. The limitation on the number of days it would be open was necessary for sanitization purposes.

The Borough Administrator reported that the County offices were scheduled to reopen on Monday.

The Borough Attorney asked the Police Chief to have his Officers address the problem with parking in the fire lane in the ShopRite parking lot. The Chief indicated that he would pass the request on to his staff.

There was nothing to report on behalf of the Borough Engineer.

He added that a portion of the parking lot has been reopened. He thanked Julie Nastasi, of T&M Associates, and the Code Enforcement Officer for staying on top of this situation.

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In light of the reversal of the plan to resume indoor dining and in order to support local businesses, Councilman Neyhart suggested that the Borough permit local businesses to continue temporary outdoor dining even after indoor dining resumed.

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#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Councilman Cioffi recommended hiring a temporary employee to monitor the recycling center. It was noted that the Borough was in the process of installing a camera at the recycling center and there would be signage informing the residents that the site was being monitored. Councilman Neyhart pointed out that Public Works employees were currently scheduled to work at the recycling center on the weekends. He felt that they should be ensuring that residents were complying with the regulations when dropping off their recycling. Councilman Penta offered to speak to the Public Works Director about the situation.

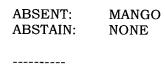
