REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Mayor Tucci commended the Recreation Commission, Public Works Department, Fire Department, Police Department, and First Aid Squad for making this year's fireworks display a success. Further, she thanked the Shore Regional High School Board of Education for allowing the Borough to use their property to shoot the fireworks. Finally, she recognized Monmouth University for their commitment to donate \$4,000 towards this event.

Councilman Bray reported that he and the C.F.O. conducted an exit interview with the Auditor relative to the 2016 Audit. The Audit shows the Borough to be in good shape and that the problems outlined in the previous Audit have been rectified. A resolution will be considered at the next meeting indicating that the Governing Body has reviewed the "Comments and Recommendations" section of the Audit.

Councilman Bray stated that there was a discussion of the items to be included in the Monmouth County Improvement Authority Program at tonight's caucus meeting.

Councilman Bray announced that the Borough's new website is expected to be launched during the month of July.

Mayor Tucci asked the Borough Clerk to send something to Councilwoman Juliano who is recovering from surgery.

Councilwoman Mango had nothing to report on behalf of the Environmental Commission.

Councilwoman Mango reported that the Recreation Commission has been busy working on the fireworks, the Summer Recreation Program, and the 2017 Summer Concert Series. Beatlemania Stage Show will perform at Franklin Lake on July 14<sup>th</sup>.

Councilman Migliaccio reported that the first phase of repairs to the Police building is complete. The air ducts are scheduled to be cleaned next week. Lastly, a firm will come in to balance the HVAC system in that building. Once the work is done in the Police building, work will begin on the ceiling in the Public Works Garage.

Councilman Migliaccio noted that work will begin shortly on the bocce courts and, hopefully, the repairs to the Franklin Lake Gazebo.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Vincent Lepore, 33 Ocean Terrace, Long Branch, commented on the following items:

- He inquired about the timeframe for the Borough’s new website. Councilman Bray advised him that it is expected to be launched during the month of July.
- He questioned whether the special emergency appropriation approved this evening will be bonded. The C.F.O. informed him that it will be raised in the 2018 municipal budget.
